

Scoring Rubric: Written Assignments & Video

The following table outlines the grading criteria for the assignments due throughout the credit-bearing internship course. The specific points needed to earn each grade are listed on the left for each assignment and the comments on the right describe the quality of the assignment. Points are awarded in half-point increments. It should go without saying that the writing itself should be high-quality and consistent with college-level standards, include an introduction and conclusion, and be free of grammatical errors, typos, etc.

Final grades will be based on *total* accumulated points, using the following numerical breakdown:

A = 94 or higher, A- = 90 – 93

B+ = 87 – 89, B = 83 - 86, B- = 80 – 82

C+ = 77 – 79, C = 73 – 76, C- = 70 – 72

D+ = 67 – 69, D = 63 – 66, D- = 60 – 62

F = 59 or lower
